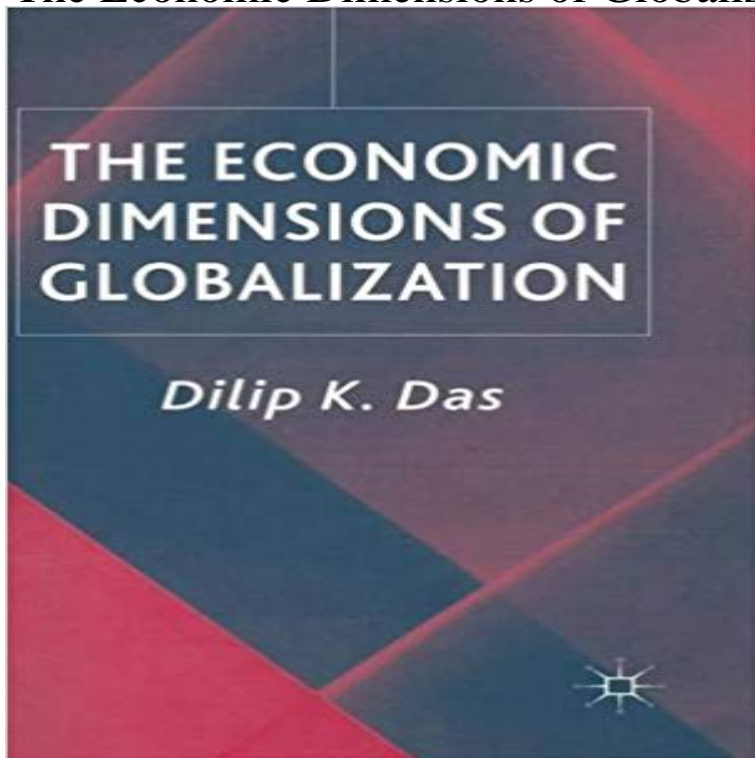


The Economic Dimensions of Globalization
