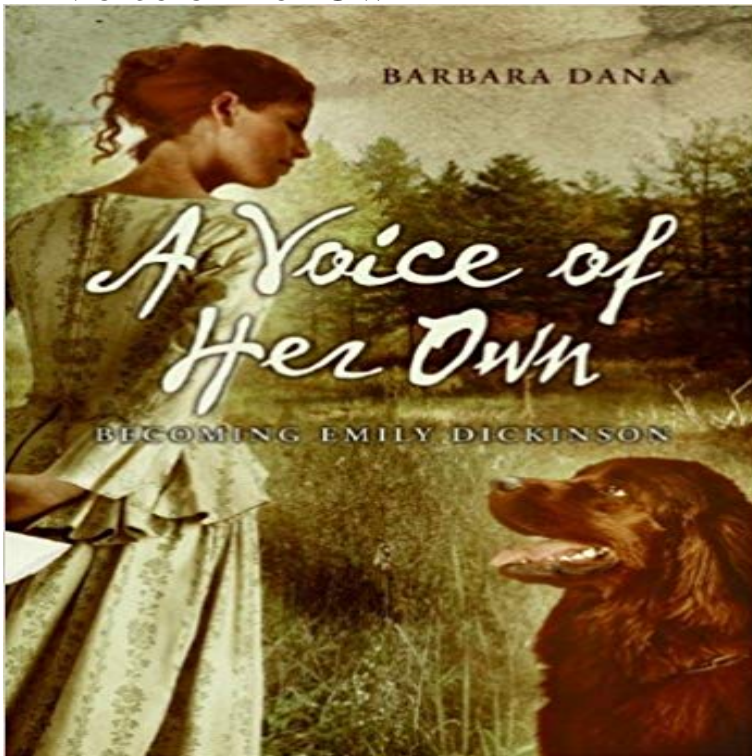


A Voice of Her Own
