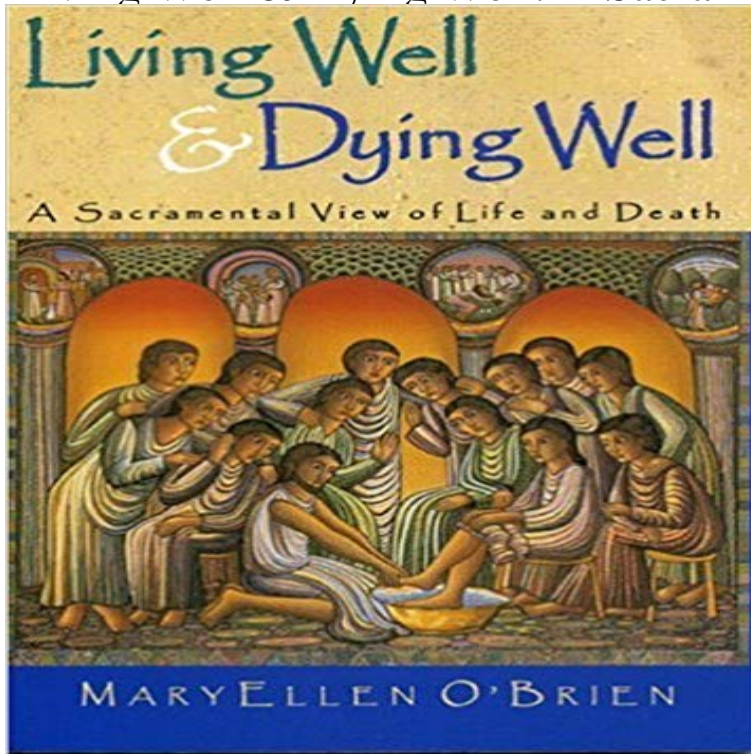


Living Well & Dying Well: A Sacramental View of Life and Death
