

## A Commentary on the Gospel of John, Chapter Three

All of chapter two is devoted to the six verses in the third chapter of the gospel that many theologians and commentators have attributed to the Apostle John. The whole idea behind that is that most people do not understand what it means to actually believeth in Jesus. The concluding chapter, which is chapter three, discusses the growth of the ministry of Jesus as well as the decline of the ministry of John the Baptist.
