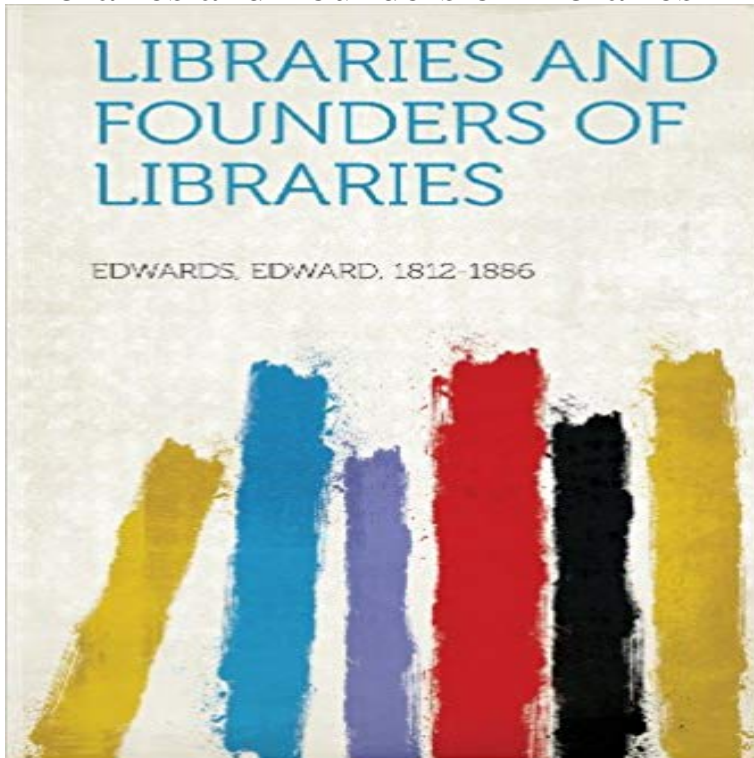


Libraries and Founders of Libraries
